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

### Don't Go to Meetups & Conferences

That said, unless it's a real research/publication conference - where people discuss and propose solutions to challenging problems - you won't find top-notch programmers in these "meet ups". Why? Because more often than not, these meetups tend to waste too much time, rather than actually solving some problem.

#### Give Unsolicited Advice

#### Don't Talk to Inanimate Objects

You can often see hallmarks of great bad programmers by phrases such as "I am so sad that my program doesn't work, I have tried to plead with it and it still doesn't give work." or by "I feel that this code is right, but I just am not sure why it won't work" or even by "I read to my program every day, and try to be a good friend, but it still doesn't like me, whenever I tried to attach to it, it gives me a core dump".

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### Just Get This <u>Amazing Thing (c)</u>

With the right <u>tools</u>, the 10x engineer can do the work of "10 engineers", because they are so much more efficient with their time and execution. While an average engineer might be fumbling their way through a process, a 10xer has already streamlined it and is two steps ahead.






## Want to be a better coder? Type faster.

When I see someone who has been working with computers for a decade and can't surpass 100 WPM for even a short burst, I'll admit, it makes me cringe a little bit. It's just lazy, as Jeff Atwood put it.

#### Go Back in Time

You should have started being interested in engineering when you were in your early teens. Now it's too late, all you can be is a normal engineer.

#### Set Up Tooltips, Make a Setup, Set Up Tab Stops

One guy, he just graduated and called himself a programmer. I asked him couple of questions.

Have you set up the tooltips of the application? Have you made a setup for your program? Have you set up tab stops according to the flow?

His answers were simple No, No, No.

#### Write Tons of Code

As proof, believe it or not, I've written 1MM LOC in under 6 months, resulting in a very functional, relatively bug free, commercial product on the scale of something like Microsoft Office (though totally unrelated). Further, the product was innovative and in fresh territory (as in, no competitive products, no answers on google, just completely on my own). I wouldn't do it again, because I was then on the hook to maintain 1MM lines of code, but I guarantee you, that's at least 10x a normal engineer. That's about 6K LOC a day. The average engineer I've worked with, puts out about 500 LOC a day, the best (but not rockstars), put out about 2K LOC a day. So its not a clear 10x mapping, but that's 12x a normal engineer, and 3x a great engineer. Screw with the numbers all you want, but there's still a clear divide between RockStar output and non RockStar output.
